

# Division of Immigrant Policies and Affairs

**The Division of Immigrant Policies and Affairs (DIPA)** - formerly the Bureau of Immigrant Workers' Rights - assures that the services, programs, and protections of the Department of Labor (DOL) are available to all workers. This includes the large and growing group of people who moved to New York State from another country.

## Outreach

DIPA informs immigrants about workplace rights. We tell them about help offered by DOL, such as:

- Action on unpaid wages, overtime, and other benefits
- Facts about unemployment insurance
- Job-search aid and career help
- Links to other agencies and groups for help
- Information about Human Trafficking

DIPA also educates small business owners about:

- Employment laws
- Their legal responsibilities
- DOL resources that can help them
- Human Trafficking

## Policies and Laws

DIPA works to assure that government agencies meet the needs of immigrants and people with limited English. We review how policies, procedures and laws affect their communities.

## Crime Victims

Human Trafficking is a crime that exploits many immigrants. DIPA helps fight it across the state. We inform DOL staff about how this crime affects labor issues. We also refer victims to state agencies that can help them get the services they are entitled to under the state's criminal laws.

Victims of certain crimes can apply to the federal government for special visas. To apply, they must be certified through a law enforcement agency. Within the DOL, DIPA reviews applications for U and T visa certification.

## Agriculture

DIPA works to strengthen New York's large and diverse agricultural industry. At the same time, we educate agricultural workers about their rights and the services available through DOL. We visit farms to help employers comply with labor laws. We also help farmers find qualified agricultural workers to meet their labor needs. DIPA processes H-2A applications, conducts housing inspections, provides Spanish language interview assistance, and works to assist the U.S. Department of Labor in ensuring that H-2A contracts are in compliance.
